MEMBERSHIP REPORT: Presented by Cheryl Nott

AHMF REPORT: Delegates not present

President advised:- Robert Shannon Foundation Grant Application to be with QHMC by 15th April 2024. Was advised that 2 applications had been received.

President advised that flyers for QHMC, National Motoring Heritage Day on 19 May are available to take back to their club and that Volunteers are required on the day.

President advised he had received a report from Doug Young as follows,

A. Motorcycle towing company offering Club Rego

A motorcycle towing company has been offering "We can supply everything needed for Club reg. No annual fees, no minimum membership crap."

And "Club rego is for anything over 30. We supply everything you need for transport office, no annual fees no minimum membership. Club rego is for life of membership also. We charge \$300."

B. Proposed formation of a SIVS-related forum for SIVS members of the TMR RMVSG.

- The old MOCC group who met with TMR was originally for the QHMC and historic vehicle clubs with SIVS members.
- Over time, TMR allowed multiple other entities to join, with issues that do not concern historic vehicle clubs. They include the RACQ (an insurance company, professional engineers, caravans, 4 wheel drives, an aftermarket industry body etc.
- Many SIVS clubs raise issues directly with TMR, and the other SIVS groups know nothing of the exchanges. TMR also no longer advises of proposed changes it seems. The QHMC believes it important that an informal group be formed of the RMVSG members who are concerned with SIVS, namely the Australian Street Rods Federation, Heritage Truck Association, Historical Motorcycle Club of Qld, MG Car Club, and the Mustang Owner's Club of Australia. The QHMC has started approaching those entities for this purpose. The idea would be to share information about SIVS issues, before raising them with TMR.
- Once formed, we would explore having occasional SIVS-related discussions with TMR (when the need arises), with none of the other entities present. The QHMC has a couple of issues it would like to raise but we are keeping these confidential at present.

AMHF (Australian Motor Heritage Foundation) Vehicle survey results;- there are 970,000 motoring enthusiasts from 834 clubs in Australia. 6296 people responded who owned 19,200 historic vehicles and spent an average of \$10,240 per vehicle per year which is around 12.5 % more per vehicle than the owner or regular vehicles.

- The motoring enthusiast-owned historical vehicle sector has a much bigger economic footprint than most people imagine. Once all related expenditures are considered, the aggregate direct turnover of the sector is \$9.92b;
- This \$9.92b expenditure also has two "multiplier" or "indirect" impacts on the economy – a supply chain effect and a consumption effect. This means that each \$1 spent on an historical vehicle has more than a \$1 overall impact on the economy;
- The total value of expenditure on motoring enthusiast-owned historical vehicles is – including direct and indirect effects - \$25.2b;
- The impact of motoring-enthusiast owned historical vehicle expenditure creates 78,670 jobs across the country (42,150 direct and 36,520 indirect);
- Those jobs generate \$6.2b in wages and salaries (\$2.8b direct and \$3.4b indirect); and

- The motoring enthusiast-owned historical vehicle sector's value-added (i.e. contribution to Gross Domestic Product) is \$11.4b (\$4.3b direct and \$7.1b indirect).

Life span of tyres were discussed, more information coming.
