In Kevin Eeles' absence, Richard Egglesfield presented the monthly report and moved that the report be adopted & bills approved for payment. Seconded: John Green (Mustang) Carried.

Queensland Transport Report: Rod Graydon (Sunbeam) reported that a scheduled QT liaison meeting would occur on 23rd June and asked if delegates had any items that should be discussed with QT. There were no new items presented from the floor.

Rod also informed the meeting about the 'workaround' process that is now required for renewing the registration of all SIVS registered vehicles over 4.5t GVM. Rod advised that it seems that QT has updated its systems to require a full mechanical check for heavy trucks when they renew their registration even though the inspections are not required for registering SIVS trucks.

The 'workaround' for > 4.5t GVM is for QT to temporarily record the SIVS registered truck as being a 'remote location vehicle' ('remote location' vehicles do not require the annual inspections) then QT can renew the registration. Managers in all QT service centres have been advised of the 'workaround'. It does however mean that members renewing SIVS registration for > 4.5t GVM trucks are required to visit a QT customer service centre and may need to advise QT that there is a 'workaround' for renewing the registration of > 4.5t GVM trucks. Clubs are asked to include a notice to members in their magazines to advise members of the renewal process workaround

Rod also reminded delegates of the problems that can arise when registering SIVS vehicles where the previous registration details are not known. Rod indicated that because of changes in the legislation regarding imported vehicles it is now much harder to register a vehicle where there is no evidence of previous Australian registration. Rod advised that people attempting to register a vehicle where the previous registration details were not known should take as much evidence as they can gather to show the vehicle has been in use in Australia. stat decs from previous owners, stat dec from current owner, purchase receipts indicating vehicle history, photos showing as much history as possible.

Australian Historic Motoring Federation:

The AHMF delegate was not present at the meeting and therefore a report was not tabled.

The Secretary stated that as reported in correspondence a document purporting to be the 2008 AGM minutes was received, however the minutes as distributed do not include reports and attachments the document claims to include. There may also be some discrepancy in other items recorded in the minutes and at present, the committee considers there is little value in discussing them and distributing the minutes, as received, until the issues are clarified.

Calendar of Events: Tom indicated that he had a problem in getting an updated calendar ready for the meeting however an updated version will be distributed with these minutes. Delegates were asked to provide any additional events for inclusion.

All clubs were again asked to nominate any additional events that they wish to include as nominated events open to members of other clubs. No additional events were nominated.

General Business:

Dating Certificate (from Minutes draft distributed with March minutes and notice of motion given to vote this month) The President outlined the reasons for developing a standardised dating certificate and reminded delegates of the extensive discussion at the March meeting. David called for the motion to be officially put. Richard Egglesfield (BVRC) moved that the Council adopt the draft dating certificate as our recommendation to QT. The motion was seconded by Rick A'bell DDVVC. Richard advised that the intention was for clubs to adopt the form and then make any minor amendments / additions they required and start using the form. The President asked if there was any further discussion. The motion was put and carried unanimously

Motorfest Albert Budworth (All British Classics) updated delegates on the preparation for this year's Motorfest and outlined the improvements made for this year's event. With one day to go for entries there was very close to 800 entries for this year's event.

Robert Shannon's Grant submissions The Council has received one submission for a Shannons Foundation grant from the Warwick V&V Vehicle Club. The Nominee is Brent Beale aged 14 who is restoring an Austin A40.

Clubs were reminded that entries need to be with the Council Secretary by mid June so that they can be forwarded to the AHMF by the end of June.

CC Rally 2009. Richard Egglesfield reported that there are now about 65 entries in this year's CC Rally and the event looks as if it has been well planned and all attending can look forward to a fantastic rally on the Queen's Birthday Weekend this year.

HMC Rally 2010. Planning is well underway for the HMC Rally to be hosted by Bundaberg in 2010. The DDVVMC (Toowoomba) has commenced planning for the 2011 event.

Public Liability Insurance. Our insurance expert Jim Scott has again looked at different policies available, while one policy looks cheaper for smaller clubs with fewer than 30 members, it is much dearer for clubs larger than 100 members. QHMC Committee recommends that clubs continue to insure with Austnet. One additional advantage of the Austnet policy is that, should clubs be required to have \$20,000,000 of PLI coverage for a single event over a few days (some state government and councils are now asking for \$20,000,000 coverage), Austnet will provide the coverage for the specified event at no additional cost (clubs need to contact Austnet Insurance, PO Box 8063, Angelo St, South Perth, 6151.PH 0894738600, Mob 0488411095 FAX 0894738611 email bertr@austnetins.com.au to arrange additional cover)

AGM September Meeting. The QHMC will hold its first AGM after its monthly general meeting in September. The current Secretary will not be standing for re-election. All positions will be declared vacant and nominations will be required for all positions. This is a chance for any club member to help lead the peak motoring body representing historic vehicles in Queensland. All clubs are asked to canvass members of their club to ascertain if there is anyone interested in taking on a committee position in the QHMC. Fresh faces on a committee of any organisation bring new ideas and help the organisation evolve.

QHMC trophies. CC has been making small trophies available to clubs for events. Richard moved that QHMC purchases new trophies and continues the practice. Albert Budworth seconded the motion and it was carried.

North Queensland Visit. David James gave the meeting an oral report on his visit to North Queensland (details included in the April minutes). The NQ visit was considered a success and Richard moved that the QHMC take opportunities for a management delegate to visit the country clubs or country areas of the state at least once a year. Seconded Alex Connors. Carried

COUNCIL NEWS......May 2009

SIVS registered Trucks > 4.5GMV Queensland Transport seems to have changed its systems and now all renewals of registration for vehicle over 4.5GVM indicate that a full inspection is required. There has been no change to the SIVS rules and SIVS registered vehicles **Do Not** require a safety inspection at registration renewal, however the system appears to require it. Discussions between the QHMC and QT have developed a work around.

The work around for > 4.5GMV SIVS vehicles is for QT to temporally record the SIVS registered vehicle as being a "remote location" vehicle ("remote location" vehicles do not require the annual inspections) then QT can renew the registration. Managers in all QT service centres have been advised of the workaround. It does however mean that members renewing SIVS registration for > 4.5GMV vehicles have to visit a service centre and may need to advise QT that there is a "Work around" for renewing the registration of > 4.5GMV Vehicles. Members of clubs who have >4.5GVM vehicles on SIVS should be advised of the workaround and ask /tell QT Service Centre staff of the registration renewal workaround process if they have any problems

No revious registration details members are reminded of problems that can arise when registering vehicles where the previous registration details are not known. Because of changes in the legislation regarding imported vehicles it is now much harder to register a vehicle were there is no evidence of previous Australian registration. Members attempting to register a vehicle where the previous registration details are not known (ie you don't know a previous registration number of the previous registered owners name) should take as much evidence as they can gather to show the vehicle has been in use in Australia before. Statutorily Declarations from previous owners; Statutorily Declarations form the current owner and or club members outlining the vehicles history. Purchase receipts indicating some of the vehicle history/use; Photos showing as much history as possible and restoration steps; all help in getting the vehicle registered.

More vehicle on your club runs The QHMC are adding a new section to its event calendar The new section will be additional to the date claimer section for major invitation rallies. The new section will be available for all clubs to list an event where they would like to offer an open invitation to members of other clubs to attend one of their normal club runs.. The idea of the new section is to assist clubs in getting their events advertised to a wider audience and therefore attracting members of other clubs. Dating Certificate The QHMC has developed and clubs have agreed to use a new standardised dating certificate. When clubs members present the new standard dating certificate to the people at Queensland Transport. The form should be more readily recognised and the SIVS registration process should be just that little bit easier.

QHMC Handbook Updated A new section has been added to the QHMC handbook outlining the process required to either transfer to SIVS registration of initially register a vehicle under the SIVS scheme. Copies of the handbook will be available from the QHMV web site or form the QHMC Secretary.

QMHC New Name by the time you read this the name of the Queensland Combined Council of Historic Vehicle Clubs Inc will have changed to the Queensland Historic Motoring Council Inc. Our business will stay the same its just a name change that is a bit shorter and better explains what we do.
