Business arising from the treasurers report:

John Griffin, Military Jeep Club of Queensland asked about unknown cheque and deport report from 1 July – 22 November 2018. The current Committee took Office on the 27 July 2018, those cheques unknown and unknown deposits occurred before current Committee took Office. Bank statement indicates cheque number/deposit date without details. Current Committee does not know details of the unknown amounts.

Christine Stevens read a letter (ATTACHMENT 2) addressed to Jason Dodge in the sealed envelope. Discussion followed for the next 30 minutes:

Tom Lewis, Trevor Beutel, John Que, Val Sharp and Gavin Mc Hugh, Alex Connors, Laurie Bennett.

The individual discussion/s involving the above mentioned people by fault of a low flat battery in a recorder and the secretary not being able to keep up with the multiple conversations in detail, at best, most details will be posted (if possible) by memory at a later stage following discussion with the persons involved.

However, one point made during the conversation had requested the treasurer retract and apologise for one of the statements made in correspondence. The president told the delegate that there would not be a retraction or apology given what had been stated was based on facts.

A number of points made in a letter from Christine Stevens (Attachment 2) included at least:

- One quote which was incorrectly quoted which intern may cause a misinterpretation of what had in fact been stated. and
- A number of misleading statements some of which may be construed as defamatory against not only the current committee but past committees.

On a final note (regarding Attachment 2) it was stated that a fixed assets register was passed onto the current President (Trevor Beutel) at the 2017 AGM – Never believing he would become president, Trevor arrived at the meeting empty handed, and left after the meeting empty handed. There are a number of people which have stated they never seen anything given to Trevor at that meeting and have also stated that they were not aware the QHMC had even held a fixed assets register or why the QHMC would even need one. A certain person made a point at the November 2018 general meeting that they had witnessed something being given to Trevor at the 2017 AGM. Trevor has advised that he has never taken anything of an official nature of QHMC in the past approximate 15 months of being President, anything of an official nature relating to QHMC was taken only by the at the times current/acting Treasurer/s, Secretary/s and Christine Stevens.

Cheryl Nott made note of a letter dated 25 September 2018 hand-delivered to Christine Stevens at Nundah. (Letter no. 2) C. Nott and T. Beutel ordered off premises. (ATTACHMENT 3).

Cheryl Nott advised in 2015 a cheque donation for \$150 to Prostate Cancer Council (Nurses Use) was not deposited by Prostate Cancer Council and became a stale cheque and cancelled.

Discussion followed resulting in the cheque to be re-donated and sent to Prostate Cancer Council. **Moved**: John Green **Seconded**: John Griffin.

No Auditor's Financial statements was supplied with the Annual returns to the Office of Fair Trading since 2014-15, 2015-16, 2016- 2017, 2017-18. It is for an Executive to sort out and to pay an Auditor to do the work if necessary.

The current Treasurer is capable of completing financial statements for Auditor but a lot of records are missing.

Business from previous Treasurers Report

- · We have still not received all financial records for the QHMC
- Audits for the last 4 years have not been done
- Spreadsheets of income and expenditure so far received from Christine Stevens are incomplete or incorrect is some places
- The Acquittal for the grant of \$5910.00 from Ipswich City Council paid to us on the 4th May 2016 has now been completed by myself and we are now able to apply for grants with them. (We were unable to apply for future grants till this had been completed)

QHMC Records

A lot of time and effort has gone into trying to obtain all QHMC records from Christine Stevens. Following numerous phone calls, text messages & letters I am still yet to receive all records held by Christine Stevens.

On Friday 26th October 2018 at 11:59 PM Christine Stevens told me via text message:

u

Jason Anything that hasn't been sent to the auditor has been sent to QHMC. There is nothing belonging to QHMC at my house. Christine

"

On Friday 9th November 2018 I discovered via phone call to Greg Stevens that Christine Stevens had not sent anything to the auditor or QHMC other than some emailed files which do not contain all required information.

On Friday 9th November 2018 at 2:17pm I received an email from Christine Stevens advising that an express post package had been given to Nundah Post Office that morning and that it was sent to the auditor (John Dixon).

On Monday 12th November 2018 I drove to the auditor's office in Redcliffe (at my expense and time) to collect the package sent to the auditor. Upon receiving this package I discovered that there are still a number of books & receipts missing.

On Thursday 15th November 2018 I received a text message from Christine Stevens telling me that she was on the road to Bendigo and would not be able to do anything about it till Tuesday morning.

I sent a letter (attached) to Christine Stevens via email requesting that all records (physical & electronic) and property (if any) belonging to the Queensland Historic Motoring Council be returned to us by no later than 1pm Tuesday 20th November 2018. I have also advised that this deadline is a final deadline for the return of anything belonging to the Queensland Historic Motoring Council and that the matter will then be raised at the upcoming general meeting (Thursday 22 Nov 2018) for advice on where the matter is taken.

I did not receive any reply to this letter and some records from at least the past 4 years continue to be missing.

Now that I have done everything I can to obtain these records I am now seeking direction and instruction from our affiliated clubs to advise me where we take this matter.

After numerous phone calls to the Queensland Office of Fair Trading I have determined that there are two options given to us on this matter:

- 1. Get a court order for the return of the missing records.
- 2. Contact the Queensland Police Service and report these records as stolen.
- There are possibly other options I have not discovered for us to get these returned, however I am currently not aware of them. I invite anyone with suggestions to let me know.

While the two options we face are not where anyone, including myself, would like to take this matter, we have been given no choice.

The matter we face is extremely serious and there are hefty penalties which may be incurred if this matter is not rectified.

I would also like to note that given we have not received the most recent Deposit Books & Cheque Books I have had to drive to Loganholme, Upper Mount Gravatt and Nundah (at my expense) to collect new books to allow the Queensland Historic Motoring Council the ability to continue operating.

UPDATE

On Wednesday 21st November 2018 (after completing this report) I received a text message stating the following:

"

Jason I found a folder and it has been delivered to the QHMC registered address, ie 1376 Old Cleveland Road. I Can not locate any more and have nothing relating to QHMC treasurer remaining in my computer. Christine

I am yet to confirm if this has been received.

Once I receive this I will continue to proceed with working my way through the financial records the best I can with what I receive.

Tasmanian Tour

On the 27th February 2017 an amount of \$5,100.00 was received in the Events account of the QHMC.

On the 27th March 2017 an amount of \$5,100.00 was paid with cheque number 73. I later discovered this cheque was written out to "G Stevens"

Based on what records I have seen for that time, these two transactions were not disclosed in any treasurer's report until the July 2017 meeting.

At the AGM Christine Stevens told the meeting that receipts had been provided to Tas Events. Tas Events has advised me that nothing has been received from her or the QHMC since the grant was paid.

It has been discovered that the money was spent on personal expenses on the trip for items including:

- Accommodation
- Cruises
- Wine
- Cheese
- Meals
- · And more (receipts received from Christine Stevens attached)

Tas Events has told me that as part of their grant conditions/requirements they are happy for the money to be used for these types of purchases, however, it is my understanding that given the money has gone into the bank account of a Queensland Incorporated Association it cannot be for personal benefit. (Please correct me if I am mistaken)

Conclusion

There is a lot of work ahead of me and it has not helped me one bit not being handed over all records in the beginning.

I am at a loss as to how 4 years of financial records can be left the way it has and why these records were not audited.

The QHMC will this year have a huge audit bill of approximately near \$3000 given (including this year) we will have 5 years of financial records to have audited.

I was intending to have the records compiled and reports generated, however, I have been unable to given what has happen.

Providing I receive all required records I am now intending to complete the financial reports for the last 4 years over Christmas New Year and hopefully have them ready for auditing in the New Year.

FINALLY

It is important that Integrity and transparency be at the heart of the Queensland Historic Motoring Council. Sound and clear communication is critical to achieve this goal.

I intend to ensure that all copies of the following for the current financial year be available at all meetings:

- List of income
- List of expenditure
- Minutes

I am writing to you formally about a number of matters of concern, as follows.

You had and continue to have responsibility for ensuring various financial matters relating to the QHMC have been stiended to. As you know, a number of them are still outstanding, as follows:

Ipswich City Council – Grant for National Motoring Heritage Day 15 May 2016

Jason Dodge, the current QHMC Treasurer had cause to speak to the Council recently, when they informed him that paperwork to finalise this Grant had not been completed and submitted. In particular, they are concerned that the receipts for the expenditure have never been provided. You were aware of the Council's requirements but have failed to comply with them. They told Jason a number of reminders had been sent to you but they had received no reply.

Please provide me with the receipts and completed documentation for this by no later than the end of this week.

It is of concern for 2 reasons:

- It may have exposed the QHMC to liability, and
- (ii) It has clearly damaged our reputation with the Council and until this is attended to the QHMC is unable to obtain any other grants from it (and possibly any other government organisation).
- QHMC annual accounts;

You are aware of the legal requirements to:

- (a) collate and present documentation to the QHMC Accountants to allow them to prepare the annual accounts
- (b) have the Accountants prepare the annual accounts, and
- (c) have the accounts audited.

One or more of these requirements have not been attended to for the following financial years:

AIMVIA is 4 years old. It is the independently operated - imported vehicle industry representative body. They represent vehicle dealers, compliance workshops, customers brokers, import brokers

What do they do?

- Purpose To support a fair and competitive vehicle import industry.
- Federal government Lobbying (lobbyist Peter Greenwood), meeting with politicians and their staff
- Media issue media statements, write articles, interviews for mainstream and specialist automotive media.

ASBESTOS - ZERO TOLERANCE IN AUSTRALIA

Zero-tolerance has been the law since 31st December 2003.

A vigorous debate took place at 2017 AGM. The issues have come to the forefront by 'Border Force' taking a hard line on the 'Zero Tolerance' requirement as applied to vehicles.

Many new vehicles have been recalled due to the presence of Asbestos.

Political advice is that AHMF should stay well back from this issue, although it is already affecting the movement of Historic and Classic vehicle in and out of Australia. The way around this would involve making arrangements with Border Force.

- Put the vehicle in a sealed container or wrapping before taking to an authorised workshop where the asbestos is removed properly.
- Obtain certification that the job has been completed correctly, so the car is free to restore with non-asbestos brake linings,
- The vehicle can then go into the community.

Asbestos has been found in numerous components of vehicles being imported.

Neville Horner (CMC WA), explained that his research had revealed that there is a difference between the OHMS Act and the Customs Border Force Act, on this issue and he feels that the AHMF should challenge the authorities on this. His suggestion was not supported by those present.

Terry Thompson (CMC NSW) advised, Boss Craft in NSW has asbestos removal in California or wraps up and removes under controlled conditions here.

(Terry Thompson (CMC NSW) advised he was not the person chosen to make submission to the minister re asbestos.)

<u>Stephen Hledik</u>, Superintendent, Trade & Goods Operational Policy, ABF Governance Branch / Strategic Border Command, Support Group , Australian Border Force

Stephen advised Asbestos previously had numerous; it was in cigarette filters, cupboard doors, etc.

There is an Asbestos Eradication Agency Conference in Sydney 18 - 20 November. AHMF to investigate of it would be beneficial for AHMF committee member to attend.

The standard is defined by Department of Jobs and Small Business

100% of goods imported into Australia are risk assessed.

Taking a sample by scraping can be considered as "by destructive means". They do not destroy a vehicle. The scraping is tested on an electron microscope.

In Australia they use NATA approved laboratory.

There are 4 types of asbestos.

Last year there were 83 detections - 4 in building materials, 3 in non-motor vehicle related parts and 76 in motor vehicles. As the major detections are in motor vehicles this is where they have allocated their resources.

Agenda item 1 Introduction and welcome

TMR - Nigel Ellis

Nigel Ellis welcomed the MOCC members to the October meeting and introduced Daniel Kaden and Shane Lonsdale from TMR and Brian Kearney and Ian Goodwin from the Office of State Revenue.

Minutes of the last meeting held on 13 March 2018 were agreed as a true and accurate record of the meeting.

Nigel Ellis read through the actions from the previous meeting. All action items were closed.

Agenda item 3 Luxury Vehicle Duty OSR - Brian Kearney

Brian Kearney from the Office of State Revenue, spoke about changes to vehicle registration duty that commenced on 1 July 2018. The changes increased vehicle registration duty by \$2 per \$100 of dutiable value for vehicles with a dutiable value of more than \$100,000. Brian advised the group that

this change delivers on an election commitment that included a package of revenue measures designed to help pay for the important services of government, without impacting most Queenslanders. Due to these changes, it is anticipated that the government will raise an additional \$75.8 million in revenue between 2018-19 and 2020-21.

The group also briefly discussed the Luxury Car Tax (LCT). The LCT is a federal tax imposed on cars with a GST-inclusive value above the LCT threshold.

Agenda item 4 Alteration of Personalised Plates TMR - Nigel Ellis

Nigel Ellis spoke about the important role of official issued number plates. Number plates are an essential part of being able to accurately identify vehicles being used on Queensland roads and assist in enforcement of road rules, tolling and identifying vehicles that might have been involved in a traffic incident.

In Queensland, both standard and personalised plates are manufactured to very specific standards, which ensures that plates are visible in a range of situations and that they can be read by various detection cameras. The Department of Transport and Main Roads will either issue a specific standard plate or attach a personalised plate when a vehicle is registered, and the registered operator is required to physically fit that specific plate to the vehicle.

Recently, there has been an increase in situations where the standard or personalised plate have been modified or copied (also known as cloning plates), before being attached to the vehicle. While this may have been done for a range of reasons, copying or altering a registration plate is illegal and may result in the registered operator receiving a fine of more than \$300.00. This applies even if the copied or altered plate show the same number and letter combination as the legitimately issued plate.

Nigel Ellis request for MOCC members to disseminate this message with their club members.

Action: MOCC members to disseminate information about coping or altering registration plates with their members.

Agenda item 5 New Lift Laws for 4WD Vehicles

TMR - Shane Lonsdale

Shane Lonsdale briefly discussed the changes to vehicle lift modification laws announced last month by the Minister for Transport and Main Roads. The changes, which follow consultation with industry, will raise the maximum <u>certifiable</u> vehicle lift in Queensland from 125mm to 150mm. This will make Queensland consistent with the National Code of Practice and other states.

The Minister also announced that for vehicles with electronic stability control, vehicle owners will be able to raise their vehicle up to 75mm (incorporating a maximum 50mm suspension and/or 25mm tyre increase) without certification. These changes are in line with rules that apply in both NSW and Victoria and is more flexible than national model law, making it simpler and easier for everyone to understand their obligations.

The above stated vehicle lift changes will come into effect later in October 2018.

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Agenda item 6 General Business

Western Australia's Veteran or Vintage Vehicle Concession

Doug Young discussed the way WA Clubs handle single vehicle events. In WA, events should be advertised in club newsletter, magazine or website, however the use of a vehicle participating in an impromptu event involving one or more vehicles may be acceptable and must be recorded in the club's official 'Run Log'. Some clubs manage these impromptu events online, with members completing an online form which automatically updates the club's official run log.

Action: Doug Young to provide an example to the group.

Proposed changes to Historic Vehicle Import Entitlements

Doug Young raised the proposed changes to Historic Vehicle Imports Entitlements, particularly the loss of the right to import medium and heavy goods vehicles (class NB and NC). Shane confirmed that these changes are being progressed as part of the reforms to the Commonwealth Motor Vehicle Standards Act. As this is a Federal Bill, issues regarding pathways for vehicle enthusiasts to import vehicles historic heavy vehicles should be raised with the Department of Infrastructure, Regional Development and Cities.

MOCC Membership

Nigel Ellis suggested inviting a representative from 4WD Queensland and Caravanning Queensland to future MOCC meeting. MOCC members agreed to this suggestion.

Action: TMR to extend invitation to future MOCC meetings to 4WD Queensland and Caravanning Queensland.

Incorporated Status of Clubs

The issue of membership of non-incorporated car clubs being used to enter the SIV Scheme was raised by the group. Currently, when applying for the Special Interest Vehicle Concession, evidence of current club membership with a Queensland incorporated vehicle club is required. However, the incorporated status of the club is not confirmed at the time of application.

This discussion prompted Colin Chapman to question the requirement for car clubs to be incorporated in Queensland, as the Australian Street Rod Federation Inc was originally incorporated in another state.

- Action: TMR to investigate options available to confirm incorporated status of club before granting a concession.
- Action: TMR to investigate the possibility of allowing clubs to be incorporated anywhere in Australia.
