# **NEWSLETTER No 4**

2nd September 2020

## **MEETINGS**

The Committee has been advised from the land lord that as from the 1st September 2020 the club rooms can hold 50 people in a meeting under a Covid-19 safe plan as per Cafes and Restaurants (See instructions Below). With this new information in mind it was decided to go ahead with the September General meeting from 7pm to 8.30pm and the AGM from 8.30pm until 9.30pm in an effort to get back to "normality" as soon as we can. HOWEVER this is subject to change if the Covid-19 situation worsens. We will send out emails and a notice on the website if this eventuates .

"The new restrictions do not apply to businesses operating under a COVID Safe Checklist and therefore we are exempt.

I understand that some clubs may elect to discontinue meeting while there are active COVID 19 cases in the community, but for those who wish to continue meeting the following instructions need to be adhered to in order to comply.

Under the Directive No.5, we are operating a Community Facility/Meeting Hall with the following restrictions;

- For seated patrons only
- No buffet self-service
- As the auditorium is less than 200m<sup>2</sup>, we are allowed to have 2m<sup>2</sup> per person capped at 50 people
- Must observe the 1.5metre physical distancing rule.

Under our COVID Safe Voluntary Checklist we must:

- Not allow people to enter who have symptoms of COVID 19 or who have been in contact with active cases.
- Have separate entrances and exits for high traffic areas such as toilets etc.
- Provide hand washing facilities where practical
- Provide hand sanitiser stations
- No communal refreshment or water stations

### What does this mean for us?

- The Kitchen is closed to general traffic with no self-service tea and coffee or cakes and biscuits.
- The Veranda is still available for dinner before meetings with a few new rules
- The Auditorium is limited to 50 people as long as 1.5metre physical distancing is observed, members from the same household do not need to distance themselves."

"The Veteran Car Club will.

- Provide another hand washing station on the veranda near the cold room, this has liquid soap, running water and paper towel dispenser.
- Provide Hand Sanitiser Stations at the front entrance, sliding door entrance and kitchen servery.
- The front door is a two way entrance and exit.
- The North facing sliding door is an Entrance only
- The East facing sliding door is an Exit only
- The kitchen entrance from the Auditorium is blocked to the kitchen and is the entrance to the toilets only.
- The toilet exit is to the veranda entrancing back through the sliding door."

### **AFFILIATION FORMS**

Remember that **NO PAYMENT** is required for continuing clubs, however we need the forms filled out and returned by 10th September 2020 to build our new data base. If your AGM is after this just fill in the form, return it and when you have a change of officers just email us the new info and we will amend our database.

Clubs that don't send in the re Affiliation form before the end of September could miss out on the FREE period.

This means you have to allow time for other members to consider your proposal and respond. Some clubs have adopted 48 hours as the minimum between the time of posting and the start of the run. This seems a reasonable time to extend the invitation. It may be other members are not interested in joining your proposed run, but they must be given the time and opportunity to consider it".
